The AFE TARC (Team America Rocketry Challenge) team flew their challenge rockets



(uniquely named X, Y, & Z) over 3 weekend launches at Moffett Field in March. After several practice flights, they called their first qualifying flight on Saturday the 21st, with an altitude of 801 feet (the challenge was for 800 feet) and time of 55.35 seconds (the challenge time is 46-48 seconds). That put them in a good position for their next flights. Their 2nd "qual" flight turned into a learning experience, as it spiraled across the sky reaching only 687 feet in a flight of 47 seconds. After careful inspection of the rocket, they noticed that it had been damaged in a previous flight, which explained the odd (and violent) trajectory it had followed. Wish them well, as their final chance for qual flights comes on Sunday, 3/29 at Moffett. Over 50% of TARC teams don't get through qualification, so they're already winners for getting their rockets built, flying to spec, and already being in the top 50% of the national teams!



AFE Yearbook Guidelines

- Page size: 8.5 x 11 inches
- Margin/white border: at least 1/4 in. on all sides. (3/8 to 1/2 in. is better)
- · File Format: jpg (max. quality) or pdf
- · Resolution: 300 dpi
